

April 2026—From MOAA Magazine:

A postcard scam targeting veterans and their spouses in North Carolina mirrors similar fraud attempts reported last year in other states, with con artists offering up to \$185 a month and free dental coverage to those who call a toll-free number within five days.

“No such program exists,” said a [March 27 press release](#) from the North Carolina Department of Justice, which included a photo of the postcard touting a “Veteran Savings Program.”

The release also offers simple advice for recipients: “Throw the card away.”

August 2025-- From the Post Webmaster

Text scams are on the rise. Recent examples:

- You have overdue traffic tickets or toll road charges
- They are trying to deliver your lost package
- A recruiter found your resume' and offers you a job

These are almost always scams, trying to get your personal info or money.

If there is a chance that the text is legit, use some other means to verify it, (go to the sender's website) but do NOT reply directly to the text!

Dec 2024-- From the VFW National Webmaster:

Scammers are sending spam emails saying that your email <password> will expire soon, and you should click a link to "Renew your Password".

DO NOT DO IT!

If you are asked for the password to your email,

DO NOT GIVE IT!

DELETE the spam email and block the sender.

Giving away your email password CAN and WILL have catastrophic effects on the email server.

A legitimate party will NEVER ask you for your email password, nor will your email password expire.

Sadly, many people are falling for this fraud.

Your email password should be considered as sensitive as your social security number.

Remember, if it looks suspicious, do NOT participate in their request.
